Drink this, all of you; this is my
blood of the new covenant,
which is shed for you and for
many for the forgiveness of
sins. Do this, as often as you
drink it, in remembrance of
me.

Great is the mystery of faith:
Christ has died:
Christ is risen:
Christ will come again.

Father, we plead with
confidence his sacrifice made
once for all upon the cross; we
remember his dying and rising
in glory, and we rejoice that he
intercedes for us at your right
hand. Pour out your Holy Spirit
as we bring before you these
